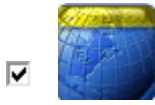

These reference materials once were accessible only in the library, but now you can access them online from the library or remotely 24/7. Because each library creates its own eBook collection, the content you see may vary if

you use the database at different libraries (your school, your public library, or your office).
